

# The King's Coronation Celebration Grant

The coronation of His Majesty The King Charles III on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023 will be a time for celebration, community spirit and for creating lasting memories.

To mark this historic event, Barton Upon Humber Town Council is pleased to be launching the King's Coronation Celebration Grant.

Grants of up to £100 will be considered by the Town Council to support local communities, voluntary groups, schools and charities, to either hold their own Coronation events and celebrations, or to carry out a Coronation project to mark this special occasion.

## Apply:

Applications should be submitted by **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> Marc 2023**, late applications will not be accepted. All applications will be considered and all applicants will be notified by **Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2023**. **Application forms can be found here.**

## Criteria:

- Projects funded by this grant must take place during the Coronation extended bank holiday weekend (Saturday 6 – Monday 8 May 2023).
- All activities under this grant must celebrate The King's Coronation.
- Events must demonstrate a strong Coronation theme and not form a request for funding to cover existing events costs.
- Community events must be open allowing the whole community to get involved
- All events and/or projects must be based within Barton Upon Humber
- A key theme for all events, projects or permanent features must be sustainability. King Charles III has been a campaigner for the environment for 50 years and continues to champion sustainability. Applicants are asked to join the King in considering the sustainability of their celebration and minimising its negative impact on the environment e.g. replacing single use plastics, prioritising local suppliers. Applications with a strong approach to protecting the environment, and sustainability and celebrating our natural world will be prioritised.
- Payments cannot be made to personal bank accounts, where a group does not have a bank account they must provide the name of an organisation that is willing to manage the funds on their behalf.

## Things to consider

This is a great opportunity for communities to come together and we all want the celebrations to be a success. There are some things you will need to think about to ensure that your celebration is run safely and so that everyone can enjoy it. These are some of the things that

you might need to have in place: • risk assessments • insurance • permission to use a public space • licences • permission to close a road.
