141. To receive a 5 minute report to up-date the Town Council of each respective outside organisation

(a) Barton Lions Club

Recently provided Hi Vis equipment to Barton Baggers Group. Have adopted Barton Upon Humber Station platform and completion of installation of new planters is ongoing.

(b) Barton Civic Society

The project work on Soutergate is ongoing and currently the grass is high and requires some maintenance which the land owner will be organising.

145. Competition Update

a) CPRE Best Kept Village competition 2021 Best Kept Town Population over 4000

147 **Update on Grass Cutting**

No further complaints have been received. It was suggested that the Clerk contacts Kcom management to ask how the verges are going to be repaired as many have been left damaged by the works, particularly any bulbs displaced by the work.

148. Update on Planters and Hanging Baskets in the town

Members considered the costs for up the pole baskets and also discussed purchasing new tiered planters for the town. Town Clerk explained the budget and

it was agreed to further consider at the next Environment meeting a budget for next year for purchase of new equipment. It was also agreed to contact North Lincolnshire Council to enquire which planters they owned that are not maintained by Barton Town Council and whether there would be any further grant funding if Barton Upon Humber Town Council took over the maintenance to improve the floral look of the town.

149. **Community Bulb Planting**

Members discussed community bulb planting. It was agreed to ask order the usual mix of bulbs up top £600 which includes the Lions contribution of £300. A date for planting was made on the 31 October with planting areas identified as Butts Road Car Park, Tofts Road Playing Field and Dam Road Playing Field (Hunts Charity). Town Clerk to seek approval from North Lincolnshire Council.
